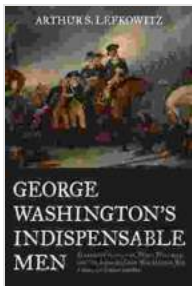


George Washington: The Indispensable Man of American History

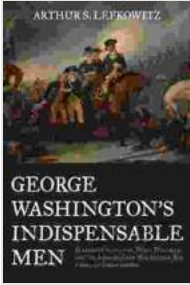

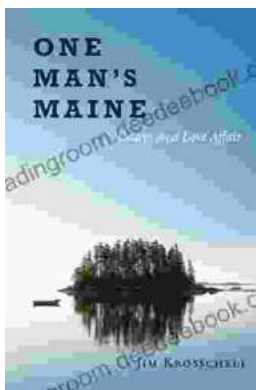
