

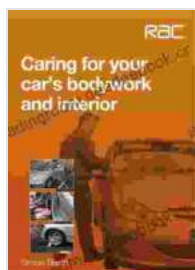

Washing

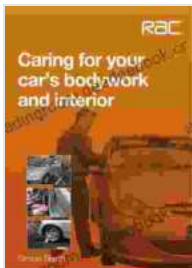
